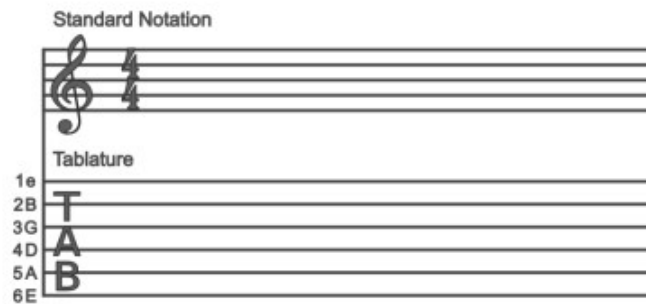


TABLATURE EXPLAINED

Tablature, or TAB is a simple guitar guide that tells you where to place your fingers on the fretboard. Of course, you need to know which string to play as well. There are six strings on the guitar. This means we need six lines for each string:



Hold your guitar flat so you can see the strings. Each string is a line in TAB. It is also in the same order, even for left hand players.

The Thick **E** String is at the bottom. The thin **E** string is at the top. The strings in order are:

E A D G B E

In TAB it isn't important to know the names of the strings but the string names are useful to aid learning and it's fun to remember this phrase:

Eddy Ate Dynamite Good Bye Eddy

The numbers that will be placed on the lines are the fret numbers. 0 will show that the string is played open (not held down).

Above the TAB line is a standard music staff, used by all musical instruments. This will be used to explain the rhythm.
